The Early brothers are two bumbling hunters in Alabama who have never shot a duck, but think they shot an angel. As they lament their fates in a murky swamp, they are chased by a cynical tabloid journalist and his reluctant photographer, who don't believe any of it – until feathers, wings and a tiara are discovered along the way. Full of colorful and zany characters, *Duck Hunter Shoots Angel* is an out-of-this-world tale full of magical surprises and unexpected second chances. It interweaves a love story, sibling rivalry, tawdry media, race relations and cultural stereotypes as the chase to find the angel builds to a crescendo in the swamp.
