DRAWING FUNDAMENTALS • For ages 8 – 11. Be introduced to the basic techniques of sketching and drawing. Individual creativity is emphasized as you learn to draw landscapes, animals and people.

CLAY ALL THE WAY • For ages 6 – 8. Geared to let the youngest ceramicists explore this great medium as they roll, pinch, coil, throw and manipulate clay in different ways.

SCIENCE EXPLORERS • For ages 8 – 11. Have fun exploring the basic concepts of the sciences such as chemistry, physics, astronomy, geology and biology.

CHINESE BRUSH PAINTING • For adults. Learn authentic oriental art using painting, calligraphy and seal techniques.

THE ART OF WEAVING • For adults. Beginning through advanced students will hone their skills on the floor loom.
