MIDLAND - A wonderful choral experience awaits when the Midland Camerata Singers perform at Memorial Presbyterian Church, 1310 Ashman Street, Midland, on Sunday, June 26 at 7 p.m. The event is presented by Music Society – Choral of Midland Center for the Arts. Sognando Et Divertimento is the perfect name for this Camerata performance. Meaning dreamy and fun, members of the audience will be wrapped up in a stunning saxophone solo which melts into the lyrics of Roberts Frost's poem *Stopping By the Woods on a Snowy Evening*, or be intrigued by the choir singing *And in the Evening*, which uses crystal glasses filled with water to produce a whimsical effect. Jennifer Breneman is the featured soloist in *All My Trials*, a beautiful Bahamian spiritual, while Bob Pennington will accompany the choir as the Bodhrán player in *Dulaman*, an Irish piece that will be sung entirely in Gaelic. To add more fun in the program, *National Weather Forecast* is a humorous setting of a weather report and *Duet for Two Cats* features Jean Joslyn and Kerry Maloney, accompanied by the choir, portray a musical dialogue between two cats. These pieces are only a small peek into the exciting Camerata concert.
